

Leap of Faith

There is a scene in the movie, *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade*, when the intrepid archaeologist/adventurer is on a quest to find the Holy Grail -- the cup with which Christ served Holy Communion to his disciples during his Last Supper Jewish Passover Seder.

Indiana Jones comes to the edge of a huge and yawning chasm. He stops his forward progress just in the nick of time, and teeters there, about to fall in. Then he rights himself, and surveys his situation. He stands at the chasm's edge under a lion's head carved out of the rock. He can't go back; danger lurks there, and he must get to the chamber where the grail is. Yet it seems just as impossible to go forward, for that would mean certain death.



Jones looks again at his father's Grail Diary. He has successfully passed two challenges using its sage advice. Now he looks at the third saying which reads:

The Path of God - "*Only in the leap from the lion's head will he prove his worth*"



Jones realizes that going forward on a path he cannot see requires a real leap of faith. He takes that leap, and instead of falling thousands of feet down into the chasm, his foot lands on something solid. Looking down, he can now see a rock footbridge which before was invisible! He walks over the bridge and into the chamber where he successfully finds the Holy Grail.

That's not a bad image for the transitional times of life: the passages from one stage to another. Often in our lives, the path ahead seems invisible. We don't know exactly which way to go...or if there even is a way. And there are some dangerous chasms out there!

But where there seems to be no discernible road ahead, God reveals one! And often it takes a "*leap of faith*" to find it and walk it.

And together, we are a church...a family of God. Often in our church's life and ministry, the path ahead seems invisible. We don't know exactly which way to go, what ministries God wants us to be doing, or exactly how we are called to care for our community and walk with God in it.

But God is leading us and he reveals the roads we are to travel together...not always at the beginning...but along the way. Often it takes a "*leap of faith*" to find them and walk them. He calls us to just trust him and walk with him together.

Oh...and...I don't know that you will find the Holy Grail on your journey. But you'll be walking with Jesus. And it doesn't get any better than that!

The Witting Tree

Martin Luther Church and Faith Lutheran Church are participating in a project sponsored by the TCVSN Spiritual Support Outpost Network.

THE WITTING TREE.**

November 1st – 11th, 2019

The Witting Tree is a silent, faith-filled witness observed each day for eleven days, from November 1 through November 11 (Veterans Day).




The term “witting” means to be cognizant, deliberate, and aware to the facts of a situation. Each year more than a dozen faith communities and organizations join in hosting a Witting Tree ceremony at their sites.

We will participate in the Witting Tree project by hanging 22 sets of dog tags each day on a tree in our church side yard (near our sign on Martello Drive) in public remembrance of 22 veterans who take their lives each day by suicide. (That is one Veteran that takes their life every 80 minutes.)

We want our members and especially our veterans to participate in this project by taking a day to place the 22 dog tags on our designated Witting tree and saying a prayer. Call Sherry at ML office (843) 795-4855 to sign up.

Stewardship



Matthew 22: 36-40 “Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?” And he said to him, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets”

Luke 10: 27 And he answered. “you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.

Mark 12: 28-31 And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, “Which commandments is the most important of all?” Jesus answered “The most important is, ‘Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. ‘ the second is this: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no other commandment greater than these.”

Is our love Stewardship?

I believe the answer to this is yes! We are entrusted with the ability to love everyone and ultimately have to make the decision of how we will use this gift that God has given us. He has entrusted us with this ability that is a mirror of how he feels for ALL of us. Not just some of us. That is a hard understanding for us as humans at times because we are filled with emotions and opinions. When we are hurt or wronged by someone, how are we to still love them? How are we to love someone we don’t even know? How are we to love someone who is nothing like us? Even more difficult to answer – how are we to love someone who has committed a murder or cheated or stolen? How are we?

We are called multiple times throughout the Bible to love each other as God loves us. This is not simply a request, but a commandment. And I am willing to bet ... we all fall short of this every. single. day. I know I do!

So how does this tie into Stewardship? Joyfully and freely giving of your love to God’s creations. When we have the chance to give love and spread joy, we should take it! This could be something as simple as smiling at someone in a store, or helping someone who has full hands – or listening to a stranger when they have something to say ... even if you are in a hurry. It could be trying to understand someone who has made bad decisions in their lives and telling them they are still loved by God. It could be taking a meal to a friend that not expecting it. The list is never ending!

I think the biggest way that we can show love in our efforts of being great Stewards of this gift from God is learning to show love even when it doesn’t feel natural or right. Learning to let his love wash over us when we try to mimic his!

Join us each Sunday morning (except Brunch Sundays) after the 9 AM Worship Service for our study series.




On October 13th we will begin a new series which will connect with our SC Synod theme of “Joining God in the Neighborhood”.




